**EARTH HOUR - 28 MARCH 2009 :
LETTER FROM MORNE DU PLESSIS**

2009 is a vital year for climate change. Governments are meeting in Copenhagen in December to debate, and hopefully agree on, measures to slow down and reverse climate change. PREPARATORY SCHOOL : CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMME

The winter co-curricular programme commences today. Please note that this programme applies to all grades with the exception of Grades 1 and 2 who are involved in the integrated day.

Please note that children will be expected to attend practices regularly in order to play in the matches.

If a pupil has a clash with another school activity they need only attend one practice per week in order to be eligible for participation in fixtures. Team selection is done on merit and players who are unable to attend both training sessions will not be disadvantaged. The priority allocation applies only when the participant experiences a clash with an additional school activity. If there is no clash with a legitimate school activity, the participant will be expected to attend all scheduled practices. Coaches must be notified of clashes.

It is important to note that some overlap is inevitable as we are subject to regional fixtures and leagues in a variety of codes and we have to schedule training around these dates.

Fixtures will only commence at the start of Term 2.

KNITTED RUGBY JERSEYS: Our uniform supplier has informed us that the factory that makes up our knitted rugby jerseys did not receive the correct colour yarn from the Mill. WINTER UNIFORM GRADE R – GRADE 12

A reminder that children are required to wear their winter uniform from the beginning of the second term - **TUESDAY, 5 MAY.**

Winter Uniform Requirements Preparatory School:

Grade 1-6 Girls - HBC champagne golf shirt with short or long sleeves, tartan culottes or ***navy long pants (now compulsory!)**, navy v-necked jersey, HeronBridge tracksuit top with optional inner winter fleece—*only available at the Uniform shop*, long navy khaki stripe socks or navy tights (44 or 77 Decitex) or short navy khaki stripe socks (may only be worn underneath the navy long pants). HB peak cap and black school shoes.

***Girls' navy long pants (now compulsory!).** This item was introduced in 2008 and now forms part of the academic winter uniform. However, the culottes still remain part of the winter uniform choice and this will not change.

Please note: Tracksuit pants do not form part of the academic uniform for 2009. The tracksuit pants will remain an integral part of the co-curricular sports uniform.

Grade 1-6 Boys - HBC champagne golf shirt with short or long sleeves, long navy trousers, navy v-necked jersey, HeronBridge tracksuit top with optional inner winter fleece—*only available at the Uniform shop*, long navy khaki stripe socks, HB peak cap, black school shoes.

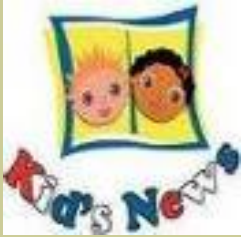
